History Repeating Itself: The Venezuela Crisis and the Anatomy of Manufactured War

Dear people of the two worlds; I write to you with humility and deep respect, guided by faith, conscience, and a profound belief in the sanctity of Ginn and human life. Before God, who sees all hearts and knows all truths, I offer these words not in anger, but in reflection, responsibility, and moral concern. I address you as fellow servant of god, bound together by shared dignity, shared accountability, and the timeless values of compassion, justice, and mercy. May these words be received in a spirit of understanding and sincere reflection, and may wisdom guide us all as we consider our actions, our silence, and our duty toward one another.

When I was asked about the recent events in Venezuela, the only intellectually honest response is this: history is repeating itself—almost mechanically, almost shamelessly. What we are witnessing today is not an isolated incident, nor an unfortunate miscalculation, but a deliberate replication of a political and legal strategy that has already devastated entire nation in the early 2000s.

At that time, a sovereign state was falsely accused of a series of grave crimes. Its leadership was portrayed as criminal, irrational, and dangerous to global stability. These accusations, later exposed as either exaggerated or outright fabricated, were used to manufacture public consent for a full-scale invasion carried out by a coalition of so-called allies. The result was catastrophic: over three million innocent civilians lost their lives, entire cities were reduced to rubble, and a functioning state was systematically dismantled.

The invading power has pushed the country beyond the point of recovery.

Its military has been dismantled—intentionally. Its industries have collapsed. Its welfare system no longer functions. Healthcare and education have been effectively destroyed. Governance has fallen into the hands of corrupt and incompetent actors installed or tolerated by external powers. Society is fragmented, and internal conflict is no longer a risk but an active reality.

More than 80 percent of the population now lives in poverty, unable to meet even the most basic needs. Food insecurity is spreading rapidly. Moreover, every time a journalist dares to ask the former and responsible president about that war and its countless victims, he laughs mockingly—without a shred of remorse, without an ounce of shame. " I look forward to seeing the expression on your face when you stand before God on Judgment Day. Will you still be laughing then? Will you still mock the innocent lives lost, the families torn apart, the futures shattered? Will you show no remorse, even in the face of eternal reckoning? "

The invading power spent more than two trillion dollars on that war—public money extracted from taxpayers—while simultaneously sacrificing thousands of its own soldiers. If one is brutally honest, the war was neither won nor lost; it ended in a strategic stalemate at best, and a political failure at worst. The only clear victors were the political elites of the administration in power at the time, arms manufacturers, defense contractors, lobbyists, and oil corporations. The public paid the price. The region paid the price, and the truth was buried with the innocent victims.



Venezuela: A Contemporary Reenactment

What is unfolding in Venezuela today follows the same script, almost line by line.

The process began with so-called *false flag operations* and an aggressive media and diplomatic campaign accusing Venezuela of various crimes. Its leadership was swiftly labeled illegitimate, criminal, and unfit to govern. Legal norms such as due process, state sovereignty, and the presumption of innocence were treated not as binding principles of international law, but as disposable obstacles.

Soon after, intervention followed—whether through direct military action, covert operations, or externally engineered regime change. Venezuela’s leadership was removed, not by its own population through lawful constitutional means, but by external force. What comes next is entirely predictable: billions—soon trillions—of taxpayer money will be poured into “reconstruction,” “stabilization,” and “security assistance.” Allied states will be pressured, diplomatically or economically, into sending troops and investing vast sums of their own public funds.

Once again, the beneficiaries will not be the people of Venezuela.

The true winners will be the current administration that orchestrated the intervention, the lobbying networks that shaped the narrative, the weapons industry that thrives on perpetual conflict, and the oil corporations that quietly secure long-term access to strategic resources. The war, as always, is socialized in cost and privatized in profit.

The Destruction of a Society by Design

Venezuela is already a deeply vulnerable state. For years, its population has suffered under extensive sanctions that crippled its economy and eroded basic living conditions. The COVID-19 pandemic struck an already weakened their system, and was followed by a period of severe, **man-made inflation** triggered by a separate global conflict. The cumulative effect has been devastating.

Today, more than fifty percent of the population is living in poverty, trapped in conditions that deny them the ability to meet even the most basic necessities of life. Families are forced to make impossible choices between food, shelter, and medicine, while children grow up deprived of security, nourishment, and opportunity. Food insecurity is no longer a marginal or seasonal problem; it is spreading rapidly and relentlessly, affecting both urban and rural communities alike.

Hunger is no longer a distant threat looming somewhere in the future—it is an approaching certainty, unfolding before our eye’s day by day. What was once a warning has now become a reality for millions. This humanitarian crisis is not confined to Venezuela alone. Its effects are steadily spilling across borders, increasingly impacting neighboring and intervening states, weakening regional stability and deepening human suffering. If left unaddressed, this expanding crisis will continue to erode not only livelihoods and economies, but also human dignity, hope, and the foundations of peace.



The Inevitable Aftermath

Within months, the population of Venezuela will understand what has happened to them. The illusion of liberation will collapse under the weight of daily reality. What follows is equally predictable: widespread resistance, asymmetrical warfare, and prolonged guerrilla conflict. This is not speculation; it is historical pattern recognition.

The tragedy of Venezuela is not merely that a nation has been destabilized. It is that the international community has once again allowed the manipulation of law, morality, and public opinion to justify an intervention whose consequences were known in advance. This is not failure by accident—it is failure by design.

Until such practices are confronted and dismantled, the cycle will continue. Different names, different flags, different excuses—but the same outcome: destroyed states, impoverished populations, and a global order increasingly defined not by law or justice, but by force and profit.
